Dear Dr. Burt,

I had the pleasure of seeing Mr. Brian Tilaro on February 18, 2008 in our clinic. As you know he is a 44-year-old right-handed white male who has been diagnosed with multiple sclerosis in October 2005, and underwent autologous hematopoietic stem cell transplantation in 2007. On today's visit, Mr. Tilaro reported significant improvement of his symptoms in virtually all functional systems. Patient examination was significant for a fixed visual impairment 20/70 in the left eye, positive Babinski's sign and mild fatigue. Prescheduled MRI of brain from 1/4/08 demonstrated multiple white matter lesions, unchanged in number and size since the last study. None of the lesions were gadolinium enhancing. MRI of the c-spine demonstrated no lesions.

Dear Dr. Burt,

I had the pleasure to see Mr. Brian Tilaro on June 4, 2007 in our clinic. As you know he is a 44-year-old right-handed white male who has been diagnosed with multiple sclerosis in October 2005, and currently he is under consideration for autologous hematopoietic stem cell transplantation. Mr. Tilaro had an exacerbation-like episode in April this year consisting of worsening of fatigue and depression, increased numbness and spasticity, and bladder urgencies. He recovered to a significant extent following therapy three weeks later. Some residuals or slowly recovering symptoms are still present. Prescheduled MRI of brain demonstrated multiple white matter lesions one of which was gadolinium enhancing. MRI of c-spine demonstrated a single non-enhancing lesion.

EDSS=3.0  
NRS=79

In my opinion, Mr. Tilaro suffers from an active form of relapsing-remitting multiple sclerosis. On today's visit he is somewhat worse compared to the last visit, a fact reflected in the EDSS and NRS scores. This worsening, however, can be transient as it is most likely due to his April's exacerbation, and the clinical scores may improve in one or two months.
